ARTICLE 1. The organization.

Eurafrica Trail is a sporting event organized by Jaleoo Entertainment Solutions SL.

ARTICLE 2. Participation Requirements.

2.1 General.

2.2. Medical certificate.

2.3. Disclaimer of Liability.

ARTICLE 5. Waiver and Refunds.

Article 6. About the Career.

6.1. General.

- The course will be properly signposted, in its entirety, either by the organization's
 marking or by taking advantage of the approved trail markers, paying special
 attention to the marking of urban sections, the marking of crossings, places of risk
 for runners and other places of possible losses and whenever necessary, and as far
 as possible, the organization will physically place someone in those places.
- A profile and the mandatory checkpoints of each course will be sent to all runners, included in the "Runner's Guide".
- The GPS track of each of the routes will be provided on the website.
- The use of the chip and bib given by the organization to the runner is mandatory throughout the race. The bib must be placed on the runner in a visible way on the front part of the body. It may not be folded or cut. The manipulation or transfer of the bib may be cause for immediate penalty or disqualification.
- In case of abandonment, it will be compulsory to hand in the bib at the intermediate points (checkpoints or refreshment posts).

6.2. Refueling.

- The five stages of Eurafrica Trail 2024 are held in conditions of semi-self-sufficiency (understanding by this term that the number of refreshment posts of these races requires runners to carry their own food and drink for the stretches between the refreshment posts).
- At the controls of the refreshment posts, containers will be placed where participants
 can deposit waste at the control point, the refreshment post being the only place
 enabled to deposit waste during the race. Doing so in other places will result in a
 penalty for the runner.

- There will be solid and liquid refreshment posts during the race, which will be detailed in the description of the race modalities on the race web page and in the "Runner's Guide", which will be sent to each participant before the race.
- Each participant must carry the food he/she believes necessary.
- At the refreshment posts there will be no plastic cups or similar, these must be carried by the runner.
- There will be a refreshment service at the finish line for all runners.
- It is strictly forbidden to receive external assistance or refreshments from people (competitors or not) during the race. External assistance will only be allowed in the areas set up for this purpose at all refreshment posts.

6.3. Passage controls.

- Controls will be placed for the passage of runners, at the discretion of the organization, according to security, strategy and access. Secret controls may also be placed at the discretion of the organization.
- Time limits will be established to ensure the safety of both participants and members of the organization of the race.
- Runners who exceed these time barriers will not be allowed to continue in competition.
- Those who wish to continue will have their bibs removed and may continue out of the race at their own risk. The bib may be collected at the finish line once the race is over.
- The safety cut-off times will be indicated on the website and in the race profile.
- Runners who are cut off, do not participate or abandon a stage of the INTERCONTINENTAL modalities, will start the next stage with a time equal to that of the last classified in the previous stage plus one hour, in the general classification.
- Failure to pass any of the checkpoints on the chip provided by the organization may be cause for penalty or disqualification.

6.4. Race Security.

• The organization will place, at certain points along the route and at checkpoints, specialized personnel in charge of ensuring the safety of the participants. It is

mandatory to follow the indications of these personnel, who will be properly identified.

- In case of abandonment, the organization staff must be informed as soon as possible.
- Medical personnel and ambulances will be available at strategic points along the route to intervene in case of need.
- In case the weather conditions make it advisable, there will be an alternative route that will be conveniently communicated in the technical meeting prior to the start.
- In case of bad weather conditions or for safety reasons, the organization reserves the right to stop the race, modify the route or vary the time limits.
- A broom team, in charge of closing the race, will check the passage of all participants.

6.5. Safety Standards.

- It is mandatory to follow the indications of the controls and the organization's security forces.
- It is obligatory to help a participant who asks for help.
- The organization may withdraw a runner from the competition and remove his bib when it considers that his physical or technical capacities are impaired due to fatigue and the wear and tear suffered during the race, thus ensuring his safety.
- The organization reserves the right to organize groups to progress together in the race for safety reasons.

6.6. Responsibilities.

- Participants run at their own risk. It is their decision to start and run the race.
- It will be mandatory for all participants of the Intercontinental modalities to undergo an official medical check-up issued at the latest one calendar year before the start of the race.
- It is our obligation as organizers and runners to protect the environment in which the race takes place, so that our impact on it is the least possible, therefore, all participants must know and accept the environmental regulations of #Eurafrica24, which aims to minimize the environmental impacts of the race and its participants.

Runners will mark the wrappers of gels, bars and other food with the bib number. This
point of the regulation will be controlled by the technical team of the race before and
during the race.

6.6.1. Penalties.

- A runner or pair will be penalized or disqualified when incurring in any of the points listed below (the referee team will have the power to issue warnings, if it deems appropriate, before applying a penalty):
- Failure to respect the marked route or signaling route to cut.
- Receiving help or refreshments (except aid) from any person, competitor or not, outside the areas provided for this purpose (refreshment posts).
- Refuse to wear the race bib, cut it off or give it away.
- Changing or modifying the markings of the material provided by the organization.
- Throwing garbage during the race, outside the areas provided for this purpose.
- Preventing another runner from being overtaken or hindering another runner.
- Not carrying the material required by the organization at each checkpoint.
- Ignoring the indications of the organization, referees, marshals or collaborators (Civil Guard, Civil Protection, etc.).
- Not to pass through any of the chip control points or passing points.
- Not carrying or not wearing any of the material indicated by the organization.
- Not carrying gels or different food supplements marked with the race bib number.

ARTICLE 7. Classification, Trophies and Prizes.

7.1. Clasificación.

The classification will be based on two criteria:

• For local modalities, the place in the race will be taken into account.

• For the Intercontinental modalities, the sum of the times obtained in the different stages of participation will be taken into account.

INTERCONTINENTAL riders who are cut, abandon or do not participate in any stage will start the next stage with a time equal to that of the last classified plus one hour in the classification of the previous stage, as a penalty.

Riders who do not complete all the stages of the Intercontinental modality will not be able to form part of the podiums of their modality/category, as they did not complete the race in its entirety.

7.2 Trophies and Prizes.

- Trophies will be awarded to the first 3 runners in the general classification of each stage, both male and female, following the order of arrival at the finish line.
- *A trophy will be awarded to the first 3 classified in each subcategory in each stage, both male and female, following the order of arrival at the finish line.
- In each stage, both the runners of the INTERCONTINENTAL modality and those who
 only participate in the corresponding local modality will compete for the general
 classification and categories of that stage, competing in the same classification, with
 no distinction being made in the awarding of prizes between intercontinental and local
 runners.
- A special leader's bib will be given at the end of each stage to the first classified male and female of the two Intercontinental modalities, the leaders of the race are obliged to wear this special bib in the following stage.

*In the stages Jbel Mousa, Tetuan and Visit Gibraltar Vertical Race there will be no subcategories.

7.2.1. Finishers.

To be a FINISHER, all Intercontinental riders must have participated and completed all the stages of the completed all the stages of the Intercontinental modality.

Runners who do not obtain #Eurafrica24 Finisher status will not be eligible to receive either a medal or finisher's garment.

ARTICLE 8. Categories.

The participants will be divided, for all the modalities of participation, except for #Visit Gibraltar Vertical Race, and the Morocco stages, both male and female, in the following categories and subcategories.

• Absolute Category: 18 years of age or older in the year of reference.

8.1 Subcategories:

- Promise: 18 to 23 years old, i.e. not turning 24 in the reference year.
- Senior: From 24 to 39 years old, i.e. not turning 40 in the reference year.
- Veterans A: From 40 to 49, i.e. not turning 50 in the reference year.
- Veterans B: From 50 to 59, i.e., who do not reach the age of 60 in the reference year.
- Veterans C: From 60 years old or older in the year of the competition.

8.1.1. Exceptions.

To ensure competitiveness, a minimum of 5 participants is required for the category to take place.

Participants whose subcategory is cancelled, not having the minimum number of participants to maintain competitiveness, will move to the next lower category in the case of veterans A, B and C, and to the next higher one for the pledges.

* Prizes will not be cumulative.

ARTICLE 9. Mandatory Material.

9.1. M'Diq - Fnideq and Jbel Abyad, Cadiz and Malaga.

- Container(s) for water reserve (minimum 0.50 l.).

9.2. Visit Gibraltar Vertical Race

The obligatory equipment may be modified by the technical direction of the race, depending on the weather conditions of each stage.

9.3. Recommended material:

- Gloves
- GPS with the track of the race or compass.
- Cap, visor, bandana
- Belt for bib holder.
- Breathable waterproof jacket (membrane).
- Gels.

ARTICLE 10. Race Direction.

The race management, due to force majeure beyond its control and not attributable to the organization, may suspend, shorten, modify, neutralize or stop the race. attributable to the organization, may suspend, shorten, modify, neutralize or stop the race.

The race will establish alternative routes, if necessary, to carry out these actions, as a previous step to a possible suspension of the race.

The Race Directors may withdraw a runner from the competition when they consider that he/she has reduced physical or technical capabilities due to fatigue, does not have the mandatory material, or his/her conditions are not appropriate to continue in the race. Their decision is final.

ARTICLE 11. Image rights, publicity and data protection.

The acceptance of these regulations implies the authorization to the organizer of the event, or to its sponsors, to record all or part of my participation in the event by means of photography, television, film, or any other sponsors, for the total or partial recording of my participation in the event by means of photography, television, film, or any other means, as well as to use them for advertising purposes as they deem appropriate, without the right of the undersigned to receive any financial compensation whatsoever.

11.1. Data protection.

Likewise, the registered participants expressly grant the organization the right to reproduce the name and surname, the qualification obtained and the participant's own, the category, the sports brand and image.

ARTICLE 12. Suspension of the race.

Jaleoo S.L. reserves the right to suspend the race for reasons of force majeure, under alert of the competent authorities and / or adverse weather conditions. In such a case the amount of the inscriptions will not be reimbursed nor the expenses of the participants will be covered.
